Project: Emotions Matter: Skill Building, Emotional Resilience and Social Support for Care Workers

Job Description: CMHA Hamilton is seeking a graduate student intern to support the second phase of the <u>Emotions Matter</u> study. Emotions Matter, launched in Winter 2021, is led by Dr. Diana Singh (Executive Director, Advanced Research on Mental Health and Society, McMaster University) in collaboration with the CMHA Hamilton clinical team. The project is focused on understanding emotional labour-intensive work and its associated health consequences for frontline service and care workers in community work contexts. This project is the first of its kind to bring together expertise in community-engaged research methodology, emotional labour, and psychotherapy to develop evidence-based research at the community-level that directly informs the development of supportive workplace resources and strategies to promote emotional resiliency among frontline emotional labourers. The project has been extended to library staff through a partnership with the Hamilton Public Library (HPL) and its partner library systems (Grimsby, Burlington & Brantford).

The intern will work with Dr. Singh and leads from CMHA Hamilton and HPL to coordinate phase 2 of the project. As a project coordinator the intern will liaise with project stakeholders regularly to help coordinate all aspects of the project including scheduling meetings, helping to supervise research assistants, taking meeting minutes, and ensuring knowledge sharing across partners. Other key tasks include:

- 1) Assist with obtaining research ethics approval for phase 2
- Assist with the launch of the Emotions Matter follow-up survey (survey programming) and perform entry, verification, cleaning, coding, and statistical analysis of the data for the research project.
- 3) Support grant writing and development for the project.

Required Skills and Experience:

- Demonstrated interest in community-engaged, action-oriented research
- Previous experience with project coordination



- Knowledge of statistical data analysis and quantitative methodology
- Skills in cleaning and coding survey data
- Ability to work with survey software programs and program surveys (Ex. Qualtrics, Survey Monkey, Lime Survey)
- Use statistical software (STATA, SPSS and Excel) to analyze and interpret data
- Ability to contribute to technical reports and documents
